

# Blessings in Our Temporal Lives

- What are different types of work you do in your day-to-day life?

Read Mosiah 2:41 to see a promise the Lord gave through King Benjamin in the Book of Mormon for those who let God prevail in their lives. (It may be helpful to know that the word *temporal* refers to things of this life, like our schooling and our financial and social situations.)

- How might this promise apply to work we do?

Jacob was an example of this promise. He worked to care for his father-in-law Laban's flocks. The Lord blessed the flocks to thrive and multiply under his care (see Genesis 30:30).
