SIMPLE IS THE DOCTRINE OF D

... This doctrine is that faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, repentance, baptism, receiving the gift of the Holy Ghost, and enduring to the end blesses all of God's children.

As we teach these principles to those we love, the Holy Ghost will help us to know the truth. Because we need the promptings of the Holy Ghost, we must avoid speculation or personal interpretation that goes beyond teaching true doctrine.

... One of the surest ways to avoid even getting near false doctrine is to choose to be simple in our teaching....

Teaching simply allows us to share the saving doctrine early on, while children remain untouched by the deceiver's temptations that will later confront them, long before the truths they need to learn are drowned out by the noise of social media, peers, and their own personal struggles....

As we do our best to teach those we love about the doctrine of Jesus Christ, some may still not respond. Doubts may creep into your mind. . . . Don't give in to those doubts. Turn to God for help. . . .

... You will become diligent and long-suffering. And then you can know that you have done all that you can to help those you love and those you pray for navigate through Satan's attempt to derail them.

"THIS IS MY GOSPEL"— "THIS IS MY CHURCH"

Just as dynamite without nitroglycerin is unremarkable, the Savior's Church is special only if it is built on His gospel. Without the Savior's gospel and the authority to administer the ordinances thereof, the Church isn't exceptional.

Without the stabilizing effect of kieselguhr, nitroglycerin had limited value as an explosive. As history has shown, without the Lord's Church, humanity's understanding of His gospel was likewise unstable—prone to doctrinal drift and subject to the influence of different religions, cultures, and philosophies....

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints enables access to God's power because it is authorized by Him both to teach the doctrine of Christ and to offer the gospel's saving and exalting ordinances. The Savior yearns to forgive our sins, help us access His power, and transform us. He suffered for our sins and longs to pardon us from the punishment that we otherwise would deserve. He wants us to become holy and be perfected in Him....

I invite you to commit yourself more fully to the Savior, His gospel, and His Church. As you do so, you will find that the combination of the Savior's gospel and His Church brings power into your life. This power is far greater than dynamite. It'll shatter the rocks in your way, transform you into an inheritor in God's kingdom. And you will be "filled with that joy which is unspeakable and full of glory" [Helaman 5:44].

BURYING OUR WEAPONS OF REBELLION

Rebellion can be active or passive....

Perhaps the more insidious form of rebellion against God, however, is the passive version—ignoring His will in our lives. Many who would never consider active rebellion may still oppose the will and word of God by pursuing their own path without regard to divine direction....

The swords and other weapons that the Lamanite converts buried were weapons of rebellion because of how they had used them. Those same kinds of weapons in the hands of their sons, being used in defense of family and freedom, were not weapons of rebellion against God at all....

In this same way, there are things in our lives that may be neutral or even inherently good but that used in the wrong way become "weapons of rebellion." . . .

... If our love of God and our determination to serve Him with all our might, mind, and strength become the touchstone by which we judge all things and make all our decisions, we will have buried our weapons of rebellion. By the grace of Christ, God will forgive our sins and rebellions of the past and will take away the stain of those sins and rebellions from our hearts....

Burying our weapons of rebellion leads to a unique joy. ... May we bury—very, very deep—any element of rebellion against God in our lives and replace it with a willing heart and a willing mind.

BEWARE

OF PRIDE.

The Book of Mormon is not primarily a historical record that looks to the past. Rather, this volume of scripture looks to the future and contains important principles, warnings, and lessons intended for the circumstances and challenges of our day. Hence, the Book of Mormon is a book about our future and the times in which we do now and will yet live....

Ancient voices from the dust plead with us today to learn this everlasting lesson: prosperity, possessions, and ease constitute a potent mixture that can lead even the righteous to drink the spiritual poison of pride....

... We always must be on guard against a pride-induced and exaggerated sense of self-importance, a misguided evaluation of our own self-sufficiency, and seeking self instead of serving others....

May I suggest that if you or I believe we are sufficiently strong and stalwart to avoid the arrogance of pride, then perhaps we already are suffering from this deadly spiritual disease....

If, however, you or I believe we could be afflicted with and by pride, then we consistently will do the small and simple things that will protect and help us become "as a child, submissive, meek, humble, patient, full of love, willing to submit to all things which the Lord seeth fit to inflict upon [us]" [Mosiah 3:19].

... As we study and ponder [the Book of Mormon], we will be blessed with eyes to see, ears to hear, minds to comprehend, and hearts to understand the lessons we should learn to "beware of pride, lest [we should] enter into temptation" [Doctrine and Covenants 23:1].

"I AM HE"

Down through history many have simplified, even trivialized our image of [Jesus Christ] and His witness of who He was. They have reduced His righteousness to mere prudishness, His justice to mere anger, His mercy to mere permissiveness. We must not be guilty of such simplistic versions of Him that conveniently ignore teachings we find uncomfortable. This "dumbing down" has been true even regarding His ultimate defining virtue, His love.

During His mortal mission, Jesus taught that there were two great commandments . . . "Love the Lord thy God [and] love thy neighbour as thyself." If we are to follow the Savior faithfully in these two crucial and inextricably linked rules, we ought to hold firmly to what He *actually* said. And what He *actually* said was, "If ye love me, keep my commandments." On that same evening, He said we were to "love one another; as I have loved you." . . .

... How did Jesus love?

First, He loved with "all [of His] heart, might, mind and strength," giving Him the ability to heal the deepest pain and declare the hardest reality.

The second characteristic of Jesus's divine charity was His obedience to *every word* that proceeded from God's mouth, always aligning His will and behavior with that of His Heavenly Father....

... When we stand before Him and see the wounds in His hands and feet, we will begin to comprehend what it meant for Him to bear our sins and be acquainted with grief, to be completely obedient to the will of His Father—all out of pure love for us.

Sincere gospel questions can provide Heavenly Father and Jesus Christ with opportunities to help us grow.

The Savior is not absent from our mortal journeys.... Time and again, with His pure love and mercy, He sustains us as we face the drama of life....

That love is evident when we sustain one another in His work. They speak by inspiration of the Lord; they understand the current issues, the moral decline of society, and the adversary's increasing efforts to thwart the Father's plan. In *holding up* our hands, we are committing our support, not just for that moment but in our daily lives....

... We *hold up* the Lord's light when we hold fast to our covenants and when we support our living prophet as he speaks the words of God. ...

To *hold up* the prophet is a sacred work. We do not sit quietly by but actively defend him, follow his counsel, teach his words, and pray for him....

Brothers and sisters, we need to do more lifting and less murmuring, more upholding the word of the Lord, His ways, and His prophet....

 \ldots As we sustain our prophet, we testify he is called of our Savior, who is "the light \ldots of the world."
